Letter from the President

Summer is over and regular monthly board meetings have restarted. The expected culvert repair projects were delayed due to scheduling conflicts with the contractor, but are now scheduled to start during November. These delays had no impact on the actual drainage of Golf Hammock; however, heavy rains over the summer highlighted additional drainage issues that the board is preparing to address. Club House activities were well attended including Mahjong, Game Night and a special presentation by the Highland Hammock Park Rangers on "Prescribed Fires." Front Entrance maintenance and repairs improved the look of our community gateway. Regulatory and maintenance responsibility research pertaining to the 20 acre "Environmental Preserve" owned by the Home Owners Association, concluded that GHOA is not hindered by State or County easement in the performance of maintenance to this tract of land. Two Special meetings were held in August. The first meeting was to discuss performance to the 2016 budget and the budget planning process for 2017, and the second discussed a proposal to change landscaping along Hammock Drive. There was another resident report of mailbox theft in late June/early July. Residents were alerted by "Shout-Out, Web-site posting, and paper flyers at the Club House. The board would like your input on the effectiveness of these notices.

Sadly, I must report that a long term board member, Shirley Kuznarik, passed away on August 21st. Whether you were in agreement with her position or not, Shirley's passion for community service, tenaciousness, and uncompromising sense of right will be missed.

The Golf Hammock Owners Association needs you. Three Board Member terms expire in December. The community is looking for eligible residents willing to provide their time, experience, and opinions to sit as board members and officers. To be eligible, a candidate must be a member of the association (i.e. the fee simple owner of title to any lot.) If you are interested in becoming a board member, please contact Mark Walczak.



MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

May 9 General Meeting:

- 1. Fire Ant Issue at Cormorant Pond recreational area: Clarke Pest Control Services will begin treating the area quarterly for fire ants at a rate of \$100 per quarter.
- 2. A yield sign located at Golf Hammock Drive and the Circle was relocated to comply with requirements outlined in the FL Traffic Engineering Manual.
- 3. Standing Rules (Owners Quick Reference Guide, Green Pamphlet) -- SR 36 has a change in wording to read "boats, trailers, RV's are allowed to be parked in driveways for a period not to exceed three calendar days. SR 21, 22, and 25 were rescinded since they conflict with Florida Statute 316.21. SR 8 was rescinded since it is no longer needed. SR 29 was rescinded since building permits require inspections to ensure compliance. SR 32 was rescinded; the rule is redundant since the Covenants clearly make the same statement. SR 17, 18 and 33 are rescinded since they are ambiguous and lacking details to enforce. SR 6 was revised to read as follows: "No construction work or related deliveries prior to 7:00 am or after 6:30 pm."
- 4. Covenant Article VIII regarding "nuisances and the removal of." Clarification of statement "Nor shall any sign, other than the standard "For Sale sign, be erected on any lot without prior approval of the GHOA Board of Directors." A draft enforcement policy was established as it relates to signs. This policy attempts to document the other sign types that have been approved by the Board of Directors. Ten sign types were considered "approved." A copy of the approval is listed on the website at www.ghoaonline.com

August 17 Special Meeting #1:

Meeting was called to review year-to-date budget and discuss preliminary 2017 budget planning.

August 17 Special Meeting #2:

Meeting was called to discuss a proposal from the Common Ground Committee to make landscape improvements to the common grounds along Golf Hammock Drive from the front entrance to Par Road. The proposal was favorable to enhance the entrance, but the cost of \$16,300 expenditure was tabled until the full impact of the culvert program was defined.

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September 12 General Meeting:

Community Drainage Issues: The July rainfall highlighted areas of concern that were not originally planned in the culvert repair project. Standing water on Cormorant Point Drive, Eagle Court, and Lost Ball resulted in consultations with Cool and Cobb Engineering Firm to offer suggestions to these impacted areas. The firm identified that the majority of the drainage issues are related to "grass dams," landscaping, curbing, and tree growth inhibiting water flow through the driveway "bio swale system." Eagle Court has no connection to the development's drainage system and relies on soil infiltration for storm water removal. Bid packages are being prepared to solicit contractors for the bio swale issues and an engineering study for a solution to Eagle Court.

Environmental Reserve: GHOA owns almost 20 acres of "environmental preserve" located along Dog Leg Drive and Duffer Loop. The area is considered a "jurisdictional wetland" by Florida but is part of Golf Hammock's watershed system. The area is overgrown with vines and other non-native invasive plants. Neither South West Florida Management District nor Highlands County has easement to this property. Maintenance is the GHOA's responsibility. Contractor solicitations will be issued to determine maintenance plans and costs.

Culvert Repair: EPI is planning to begin around Thanksgiving.

Additional Common Ground: A section of grass along Par Road, across from Lake Clara and between the Patio homes and the Golf Maintenance Barn has been maintained by the golf course. However, it is GHOA common ground, so GHOA will begin upkeep in that area.

Palm Tree Trimming: Cutting Edge, LLC was the winning bid to trim trees this year.

Lakes/Ponds: Sterile carp are being considered to help maintain some of the lakes. Until the lakes go down from the rains, chemical treatments cannot be performed. A new weed was found in Mills Pond and the vendor is researching a treatment program for it.

Subscribe for Updates: Homeowners will receive an email when draft meeting minutes are posted, and one when the newsletter is posted.

GHOA Bay: A short discussion was held and due to lack of interest by the community, the GHOA Bay will be terminated. The annual yard sale generates more interest.

Standing Rules: SR 16 was amended as follows: "All shrubbery shall be clipped and maintained." SR 34 was amended to read: "No yard work with power equipment by homeowners or contractors before 8:00 A.M." SR 30 regarding fencing on the golf course and lakes was postponed until October.

"Owners Quick Reference Guide" (green pamphlet): Changes will be made and guide will be reprinted.

Undeveloped Lots: Board will check with our attorney to clarify how owners of such lots can comply with existing bylaws and covenants.

Budget Discussion: (a) Newsletter/website discussion. Website and publication of the newsletter costs \$10,000 yearly. The website contains the same items as the newsletter. Discussions led in ways to revamp the newsletter to cut costs. Discussions will continue as we prepare the 2017 budget. (b) Front entrance wall repairs: The walls are showing signs of age, wear, and tear. It was agreed to pursue a cost estimate and then prioritized in the 2017 budget.



For yard debris, everything must be canned, bagged or bundled, and it must be less than 100 pounds and 6 feet in length. The maximum amount the hauler is required to pick up is 2 cubic yards. Anything over this amount can be picked up for an additional charge to be paid directly to the hauler.
